Counselor of the State Council of China, Head of Emergency Management Expert Group under the State Council and chairman of TIEMS China Chapter

Professor-level senior engineer and senior economist. One of the main drafters of the Work Safety Law of the People's Republic of China and a number of safety regulations and standards, presiding over the investigation and handling of many serious accidents, such as "5.7 Dalian Airplane-crash Disaster", "11.24 Yantai Shipwreck" and "2.2 Harbin Catastrophe Fire". He has rich theoretical knowledge and practical experience in the field of safety production. In 2003, he participated in Research on Technologic Issues in Public Safety - the ninth task of the National Long-Term Technology Development Plan, and served as deputy head of the task team. In 2003-2005, he served as the deputy head of the Emergency Response Working Group under the General Office of the State Council and was one of main drafters of Overall Emergency Plan for National Emergencies and Accidents. He has made a valuable contribution to the emergency management work in China.

Professor of Graham School of Management, Saint Xavier University, chairman of TIEMS America Chapter and part-time professor of Medical Center of Loyola University Chicago.
